

ESPACIO 2 FLUIDITY


The work of Valencian architect José Antonio Tramoyeres, who already collaborated in TRANS/HITOS 2011, forms another of the Exhibition areas. The installation 'Fluidity' was presented by ASCER at the first appearance of the Tile of Spain brand at the Architecture, Design and Building Exhibition, MADE EXPO, held in Milan (Italy) in October 2011, with the collaboration of the Spanish Institute for Foreign Trade (ICEX). It interprets the multiple possibilities that ceramics afford for sustainable construction in today's cities, while allowing the most innovative architecture professionals to materialise their most creative designs.

The work uses decontaminating ceramics on the outside and extruded



ESPACIO 4 DIÁLOGOS CREATIVOS

Designed by ITC's Area for Design and Architecture team, this area features a ceramic geodesic dome, developed from six types of triangular ceramic pieces, inside which a place will be generated of encounter, reflection, rest, and exchange of ideas or simply a place in which to take a break from the hustle and bustle of CEVISAMA.



TRANS/HITOS 2012: SPACES, surprises anew by unveiling innovative proposals in an array of projects and spaces, generated in distant geographic locations, which have been brought together here to create the Exhibition. Different work groups, organisations, and professionals have once again contributed their knowledge and creativity to provide ceramics, as outstanding material and comprehensive solution, or solution in combination with other materials, with a key role in architecture and interior design. In this year's event, the proposals display different morphologies and seek to embody the ability to adapt to an everchanging world. 'Spaces' feature the alliance of teams of people engaged in architecture, interior design, urban development, habitat, design, communication, etc., creating synergies to develop projects aimed at achieving flexibility and a sustainable habitat, using major technological advances in which ceramic tiles play a key role as solutions in both urban and private domains. TRANS/HITOS is funded by the Valencian Institute of Small and Medium-sized Enterprise (IMPIVA) of the Valencia Regional Department of Economy, Industry, and Commerce through the European Regional Development Fund (ERDF), with the support of the Spanish Ceramic Tile Manufacturers' Association (ASCER) and the CEVISAMA Organisation.

Through walls and lattices produced by stacking up different ceramic pieces, as an expression of tile reusability, a selection of prize-winning projects is displayed from the ten Ceramics for Architecture and Interior Design Awards organised by ASCER, the Spanish Ceramic Tile Manufacturers' Association, awards firmly consolidated by the high-level competition.

### Architecture category

First Prize: 'MUCA. Music Hall and House' in Algueña (Alicante) by Studio COR (Miguel Rodenas + Jesús Olivares). Intelligent use of the scarce available economic means and an expressive capability of the iridescent ceramic cladding, which plays the lead role in a variable situation with regard to the light, and a balanced relationship with the environment in which the construction is located.

Special Mentions: 'Municipal Auditorium of Teulada' by Francisco Mangado and 'UPI Gandía (Universidad Popular Infantil)' building by Ángela García de Paredes and Ignacio Pedrosa.

### **Interior Design category**

First Prize 'Collage House in Call de Girona' by Bosch-Capdeferro (Elisabet Capdeferro and Ramón Bosch). Poetic and intelligent use of existing ceramic pieces. The use and combination of ceramics open up an optimistic path that knows how to position itself in a wonderful relationship with other

Special Mention: 'L9 Fira 2 underground station in Barcelona' by Toyo Ito.

### Degree Project (DP) category

First Prize: 'Mosaic. Spa, Hotel and Restaurant in Bath (England)' by Patricia Bouzas Pascual. Ceramics offer an excellent solution as they can be custom moulded to requirements, to solve details of complex structural latticework pieces. That same vocation for flexibility of use pervades the entire building.


